Fire Fee Information Guide

New Fire Fee- Effective October 1, 2022

Smith's Station Fire Protection District will now differentiate between types of occupancies to better reflect its size and the risk it represents. Whereas in the old fire fee system large apartment buildings paid the same amount as small single family residences, the new system will take into account the larger and commercialized spaces in our district, and collect a different amount from those spaces than we do from residential occupancies. The commercial spaces will instead be billed according to its individual square footage. The current \$50 fire fee paid to the County Commission annually cannot be discontinued until its expiration in 2036, so until that date, the amount billed by the fire district will be offset by that amount in order to ensure no one is overpaying or in effect "paying twice"
